Mini Camp Grades 1-2, Camp Don Bosco

DAY CAMP

Grades 1-8, Camp Don Bosco

Wildlife Wonders

Become an expert animal tracker as we discover what animals live around us. Meet lots of animals in a special trip to the Woodland Park Zoo.

Horsin' Around

Become a cowboy or cowgirls this week! Spend 1 ½ hours each day at the corral learning basic riding skills in the arena or on a trail ride and all about horses in a ground lesson. Campers in grades 1-2 will be led during riding.



SPECIALTY CAMPS

Each specialty camp focuses on a theme while still allowing time for doing resident camp activities.



Outdoor Living Skills Grades 3-8, Camp Don Bosco

Learn the art of making a 1 match fire, building shelters, and exploring the woods. This program prepares participants for Tatonka, Nanamakee, and is an ideal choice for those in scouting.

Culinary Grades 3-8, Camp Don Bosco

The kitchen is yours! Create tasty meals and desserts under the guidance of our Chef. Cooking activities will be age appropriate.

Tatonka Grades 6-9, Camp Hamilton

Venture out of main camp on a four day camping expedition. Learn survival and backcountry camping skills in this small group trip.

Mountain Biking Grades 6-9, Camp Hamilton

Get ready for an exciting session rushing down trails and roads as you learn the basics of safe riding. Experienced counselors challenge campers to reach individual and group goals. Campers must bring a bike and a helmet.



Horse Camp Grades 3-9, Camp Don Bosco

Immerse yourself in horsemanship and the cowboy lifestyle! A horse will be assigned to you for the week and our experienced staff will help you improve your balance, learn safe riding, and how to care for horses. Campers are assigned to riding groups according to skill level. Each group will spend 1 ½ - 2 hours at the corral a day. Boots with a ¾ inch heel and smooth sole required.

Trail Scouts: Grades 3-5 Younger riders focus on arena work while older riders explore the trails around camp.

Appaloosa: Grades 6-9 (beginner): Learn to ride and improve your skills in the arena and on the trail.

Wrangler: Grades 6-9

(intermediate or advanced): 2 or more years experience. Spend additional time at the corral saddling and riding. You'll focus on balance and control at the trot and lope.
